She uses large-scale paintings to discuss our boundless culture of consumption and waste through a critical, and very pink, lens. Louis Bockner, Argenta-based photographer, presents his exhibition, 'Road's End,' which is an ongoing project telling the story of life at the end of the road. Black and white photos describe a place where the old ways are still present and how self-sufficiency and community may be the ultimate currency in a future shaped by economic uncertainty and climate change.
